Rs 500 and Rs 1000 are not going to be legal tender from midnight on Tuesday 9 November, 2016. This surprise announcement was made at 8:00pm on 8 November, 2016 by Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi. "Has the country not been looted in last 70 years?"-stated PM to show that it was a decision to eradicate corruption and the menace of black money. However notes except the two mentioned above will be considered as legal tender. He announced that Rs.500 and Rs.1000 notes can be deposited in an individual's bank or post office accounts between November 10 and December 30. Currency of upto Rs.4,000 can be exchanged from any bank/post office till November 24 by showing a government identity card. However, the old notes will be accepted for further 72 hours by

government hospitals, railway, air, bus ticket booking counters.

Besides, old notes will be accepted till November 11 at petrol, diesel and gas stations. PM also addressed that new currency notes of Rs.2,000 will be available to us very soon.

The economic affairs secretary-Shaktikanta Das informed that the new series of Rs.500 notes will be called Mahatma Gandhi series of bank notes and on the back side has the picture of Delhi's Red Fort. Rs.2,000 note holds the image of the Mangalayaan at the back to celebrate India's Mars Mission. Hence, this step is taken as a strong move to curb the menace of corruption.

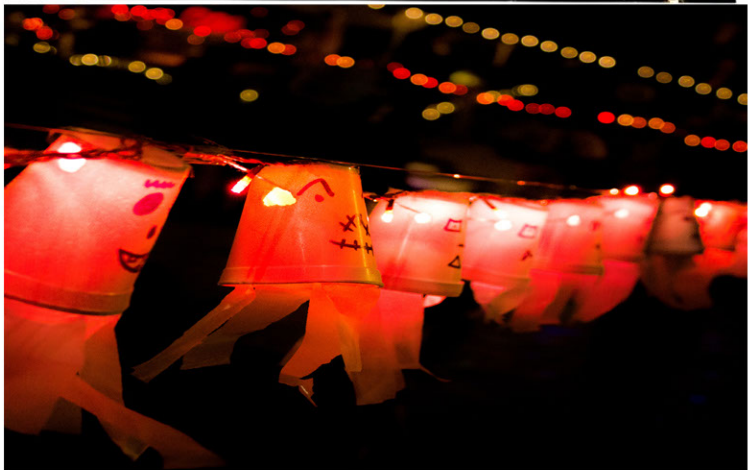

FORGED BY FIRE

Many young teenagers spend their mathematics –dreaming of popularity, but being part of the in-crowd may be a double edged sword. Popular adolescents have better social skills than their less popular peers, but they are also more likely to get into trouble.

Most people tend to think that if their children are well-liked by their peers, that would provide a safety net to their children. But mostly it is found that even though they are well-adjusted in a lot of way, at 13 these kids were at an increased risk for marijuana and alcohol use and other mildly deviant behavior. Although popular teens were most likely to try drugs, the study found that they did not participate more frequently in major criminal activities. In many cases mild problem behavior

will turn out to be relatively harmless. Previous studies have shown that teens who experiment with alcohol as a part of their social network are less likely to suffer from chronic problems than those who experiment outside of a social context. The effect of popularity may also depend on the school and community. Being popular in an area with a high risk for crime may not be a good thing as the negative influence is more likely to be seen there.

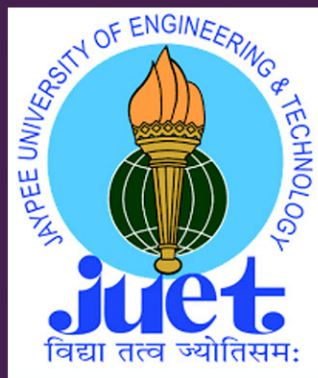
